HOLES CRISIS WORSENS IN BLACKBURN, LANCASHIRE



LENNON: 4,000 holes

BEATLE John Lennon's estimate of four thousand holes in Blackburn, Lancashire, has been deemed a "gross miscalculation" according to local resident Howard Foy.

Mr Foy, 46, who works in a bank and is an expert on holes told Sunday Sport: "Mr Lennon's calculations are wildly inaccurate."

"I have surveyed the whole of Blackburn, within the parameters set out by the 1963 Boundaries Commission, and can state categorically there are in fact at least 4,211 holes in

this Lancashire district."

He added: "Many of these holes also contradict Mr Lennon's assertion that they are 'rather small'."

"I found a particularly large hole towards the Kennelworth End of Barnstaple Road which had been caused by a mixture of heavy precipitation lying on the road that then buckled and

collapsed under the weight of so many automobiles."

"I also dispute Mr Lennon's suggestion that you could fill the Albert Hall with these holes."

US army launches groovy new Nam recruitment slogan

THE US Army yesterday declared it was embracing the "free love hippy counter-culture" in a bid to encourage new recruits to join in the police action in Vietnam.

US Commander of Military Assistance Command, Vietnam, General Westmoreland (right), revealed that recruiting sergeants would now tour American towns and college campuses employing the slogan: "Turn on, Tune in, DROP BOMBS".

The slogan will appear on all US Army recruitment material and also on a poster to be distributed nationally.

The slogan is a variant of the expression: "Turn on, Tune in, drop out" coined by counterculture scientist and drug fiend Timothy Leary.

Dr Leary has used his phrase to push his mind-altering pharmaceuticals to soft-headed

sophomore students.

Gen Westmoreland said: "Rather than encouraging our youngsters to wear kaftans and smoke dope, we hope to use our slogan for the common good."
